New Business:	The Board welcomed two members Heather Osborne Vincent and Shannon Anderson who were attending to represent those members of the College who are Classified as Practicing (Administration). Their concern is that PT's who are potential administrators and currently registered as Practicing are avoiding management/administrative positions because of the fear they will lose their Practicing classification and at a later date be unable to change their practice focus back to Practicing without going through a College induced reentry program.	MOTION: It was moved and seconded that the Classifications Practicing (Administration) and Practicing (Teaching/Research) be abolished in favor of the Practicing Classification.	

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	In its deliberations following, the absence of the guests,		
	the Board observed that we have five Practicing		
	designations:		
	Practicing Sponsored for new graduates		
	Practicing Specialists for those with a Specialty Practicing (Administration)		
	3) Practicing (Administration)		
	4) Practicing (Teaching / Research)5) Practicing.		
	But on closer examination and as explained by the		
	Registrar the Practicing classification, which represents 95		
	percent of the members, has 27 Primary Areas of practice		
	and as an example if a PT were to move from primary		
	area General Practice to Sports Medicine the College		
	would expect to see a trail of CE courses, mentoring's,		
	readings etc. that would prove the physiotherapist has		
	"qualified" to move from General Practice to a primary		
	area of Sports Medicine.		
	It was also noticed that included in the Primary Areas of		
	Practice were Management (Administration) and		
	Teaching.		
	Given this observation the Board could see how those designated as Practicing (Administration) might see they		
	are being handled differently because they have been		
	singled out re their Classification. Board members felt that		
	a PT who has a Primary Area of Practice as Management		
	could develop their own trail of CE courses, mentoring's,		
	readings etc. to "qualify" to move from Primary area		
	Management to another Primary Area of Practice like		
	General Practice or Cardiovascular etc.		
	The Board agreed to abolish the classifications Practicing		
	(Teaching / Research) and Practicing (Administration).		
	This message will be communicated to all members in the		
	very near future and those with the designations		
	Practicing (Teaching/Research) and Practicing		
	(Administration) will be classified as Practicing.
