- Have a total of 1200 practice hours in the preceding 5 yrs (if applicable).

In order to be granted a Full Practicing License you must complete the [Initial Registration Form](#) for licensure in the Nova Scotia College of Physiotherapists (NSCP). Please review the Registration Guidelines (link above) and the Registration Checklist (link above) **and return the completed Registration form along with the following:**

1. A notarized copy of your physiotherapy diploma/degree
2. A photocopy of your birth certificate / passport
3. A cheque, money order or Visa/MasterCard number for the current registration fee as appropriate in Canadian funds.
4. A letter of good standing from the previous or current jurisdiction you have practiced in, including practice hours (See NOTE below)
5. Proof of Malpractice Insurance
6. Un-mounted passport size photograph
7. Updated Resume/Curriculum Vitae with a chronological listing of previous education & employment, including a description of your clinical and non-clinical experience

In order to be granted a Practicing License you must complete the [Initial Registration Form](#) for licensure in the Nova Scotia College of Physiotherapists (NSCP). Please review the [Guidelines](#) and the [registration checklist](#) and return the completed Registration form along with the following:

1. A notarized copy of your physiotherapy diploma/degree
2. A photocopy of your birth certificate / passport
3. A cheque, money order or Visa/MasterCard number for the current registration fee as appropriate in Canadian funds.
4. A letter of good standing from the previous or current jurisdiction you have practiced in, including practice hours (See NOTE below)
5. Proof of Malpractice Insurance
6. Un-mounted passport size photograph
